CHRISTMAS BREAKFAST MEETING CHARITY COLLECTION

Thanks to everyone who brought a gift to our Christmas Breakfast meeting for the Wesley Crisis and Homelessness Centre in Ringwood. The receipts from the Sergeant's Bowl were also donated to the Centre to assist children whose families are struggling with homelessness and young people in the Eastern region of Melbourne.

On our behalf, Gary and Bev Baltissen delivered the gifts and our cheque for \$42.70 to the Centre.

SWAGS FOR THE HOMELESS

Our Community Service Committee's Swags for the Homeless project is proceeding very nicely. The club has spent \$2,000 and has obtained a District Simplified Grant of an additional \$1,000 which has enabled 36 swags to be purchased. Gary Baltissen and his committee are finalising arrangements with the Salvation Army in Box Hill and the Wesley Crisis and Homelessness Centre in Ringwood to distribute the swags to people who are forced to sleep 'rough'.

The swags are an innovative design consisting of a backpack that opens into a mini tent and is water, insect and fire proof. The swag has now been awarded a Human Rights Award. The Australian Human Rights Commission has recognised that street sleeping homeless are denied the rights to shelter, health, privacy, non-discrimination, personal safety and freedom from inhuman treatment. The Backpack Bed is study proven to improve homeless lives in all of these areas. Swags for Homeless now partners with 140+ homeless organisations across Australia but, unfortunately, has had to turn an additional 39 away due to a lack of funds.

This is a great project and another way that we make a positive difference in the lives of other people.
