At the 2012 Presidents Elect Seminar, we were told that last year District 9810 Rotary clubs paid out \$2.2 million on community support projects of which 65% went to projects in the local area, 15% to other areas in Australia and 20% to overseas projects.

LAST WEEK'S MEETING



The meeting was attended by the awardees of the Davis-Gysi Foundation scholarships for 2011 and their families, the Vice Principal of Box Hill College, Neil Davis, and members of the Davis families (except for Roger who earlier in the day had a confrontation with a bull!).

Jason O'Brien explained how he had become interested in engineering activities and how the scholarship would assist him in his ambition to do an engineering course at Monash University.

Mayha Sian impressed with her talk of working with others to be successful with school work and projects which would help the community.

Hung Vuong told how the scholarship would assist her in her ambition to obtain qualifications in some form of medical treatment.

It became obvious that Box Hill High School had made correct choices in selecting the students who showed a work ethic and who really needed the assistance the scholarship would give to follow their ambitions.

The chairperson for the night was Bob Laslett and he said the following in his introduction to the Endeavour Awards


"What is Rotary - Rotary is a voluntary organisation that aims to build healthy, educated and safe communities here and overseas. It is club-based and organised in Districts in many countries. (It is currently undergoing re-branding as people know the Rotary wheel but do not clearly understand what the wheel stands for).

Who was Ford Davis - Ford was one of Rotary's District Governors. His year was 1973-1974. As a reward (poetic licence), he was given the task of founding a new club. That club was this club and thanks to Ford, it has been active since 1975. Ford's district in those early days covered all of Victoria and Tasmania. Now our district extends from Box Hill to Healesville (both represented here tonight) and down to Carrum. Ford was a great leader and friend of the club and we have many happy memories of his wise counsel, his friendliness and his business expertise whose character was forged in the depression and beyond. Peaches, pumpkins and early mornings with Ford in the Berwick orchard are imprinted in our memories.

Box Hill High Scholarship awards - When Ford and Eve died, the Davis brothers and their wives sought to fund community projects that would commemorate their father. They did this through our club and we looked for projects that reflected Ford's interests in young people and golf. One such project was the scholarships for Box Hill High School where the Davis boys had gone to school. The scheme sought to reward students that best demonstrated the character strengths that Ford personified:

- Hard work to achieve personal growth
- Respect for others, and
- Teamwork.

The awardees here tonight have already received \$2,000 cheques to help with their education. There are no rewards without consequent responsibility. So it gives me great pleasure to introduce..."
