## **DOUG'S DEADLINE**

Another big week for me in Rotary. We had a wonderful talk by Samuel Manhom on his remarkable story of survival as a 'lost boy' in the Sudan and Kenya. Like David Vincent last month, Samuel told of long treks through the bush and surviving attacks from lions, hyenas and the most dangerous of animals – man. I am always amazed when I hear these stories of how strong the human spirit is and how, after suffering so much adversity, people like Samuel and David still want to restore peace and to help their fellow countrymen.

Samuel's message was education, especially the benefits education can bring to the people of South Sudan, as he wants to establish a school in his former home village. It has been my long-held belief that one of the greatest gifts we can give newcomers to Australia is the ability to communicate by teaching them our language. The ability to make oneself understood in the broader community reduces marginalisation, isolation and exploitation. I would like our Club to look at supporting programs conducted by organisations within our community that help newcomers to our country. The more we can facilitate the emergence of people like Samuel and David the better Australia, and the world, will be.

Speaking of gifts, it was a real pleasure to present a cheque for \$600 to Joady Barnes from the Rotary Club Manningham to help them complete their Sumba water and sanitation project. To me this is one of the highlights of Rotary membership when we can work together to achieve great things.

We had a change of pace on Tuesday night when Bob and Judy Laslett, John and Margaret McPhee, Stan Harper, Glenys Grant, David Bremner and I attended the GSE Cluster meeting at the Box Hill Golf Club. We again had the opportunity to catch up with the study team from Texas and to hear their interesting stories. The room was virtually full and we had a good representation from our Club.

The week finishes with the District 9810 Conference on Saturday and Sunday (21 – 22 April). I'll provide a report, along with Bob L and Glenys, on Monday.

I am looking for some volunteers to help staff the Rotary exhibit at the Whitehorse Volunteer Expo on Wednesday 2nd May. ## **LAST WEEK'S MEETING**

Report on Club Meeting 16 April 2012. Attendance was 12 club members, 1 partner, 2 visitors and Guest Speaker.

Announcements included

- Blackburn Station Market resulted in \$760 from sales & stall rentals. Whitehorse Market was a little below the usual attendance and stall numbers but taking were \$4,877.
- The visiting GSE Team from USA were hosted by our club for the day. All went well in visits to NADRASCA and SCOPE.
- A cheque for \$600 was handed over to Manningham Rotary for their Sumba project for 2 water tanks and 1 toilet.
- District 9810 has commenced an Eclub has been formed for Rotarians interested in making contact through the internet.

Warwick Stott advised of the passing of Charter Member Murray Whitmore on April 11. Murray was a member through until 1984. He was aged 83.

Murray played the leading role in establishing the Nunawading Family Fun Run in 1978, an annual event for the following 11 years until 1989. Murray also set up the Nunawading Half Marathon in 1980, the event continuing until 1990. Murray was a fitness fanatic and a popular club member.

The member's talk was by Chris Tuck who spoke about the declining number of people studying Agricultural Science, the increasing average age of farmers and the concern over the future of the Murray Basin Scheme all contributing to a relatively uncertainty of the farming industry in the years ahead.

Guest Speaker Samuel Manhom spoke to members on the subject of "A new school in South Sudan". His introductory visual was headed "Rumbek Melbourne Public School - Inspiring the new generation in a new nation".

Sam was born in 1979 just 4 years before war broke out in the Sudan area. Sam's father joined the army and was injured, forcing Sam to become "one of the lost boys of South Sudan". For many years, the country was in turmoil causing him to live under very difficult conditions and move from place to place with virtually no education. In 1989, he began moving around neighbouring areas searching for his father. In 1992 he was termed to be a refugee, a situation which continued until 2004 when good fortune came his way when he was accepted to settle in Australia.

In this country, he received assistance in finding work through The Sisters of the Good Shepherd. He was able to proceed with education, finishing up with a University degree. Subsequently Sam has been able to travel back to South Sudan with Manningham Rotary sponsoring his trip in December 2011. Sam found that schools were virtually non-existent, those that were there were in very poor condition. So he set out to build a new school in the Lakes Province of the country. Land to build the new school has been allocated, some assistance assured from the local education body but assistance from other sources will be needed. He is hoping that this assistance can be achieved here in Australia.

Our sergeant Stuart Williams was in fine form and raised a magnificent \$33.70 which will be donated to the Rotary Foundation.

Team members must be between the ages of 25 and 40 at the time of the exchange, must live or work in District 9810 and not be lineally related to a Rotarian.


