## FROM THE PRESIDENT'S DESK

This month the Rotary Focus is on Water and Sanitation. All of us who have travelled have at some point seen the effect of drought on this country. Having farming family in Victoria, Tasmania and Queensland I have witnessed at first hand the effect on business, community and the emotional devastation on individuals. Even today with reports of rainfall in Queensland and NSW there is still drought in this area. Rain may fall but it doesn't necessarily get to the right area. Even when the rain falls the water quality is something that needs to be tested. Rubbish, including plastics and toxins, gets swept into rivers and dams. It is important the water quality is carefully monitored.

Recently Glenys and I joined members from Nunawading and other community groups and locals in a clean-up Australia Day at Blackburn Lake. In a period of about two hours we crawled, climbed and wriggled our way through the bush and amassed over 200kg of rubbish in and around the lake. Most of this rubbish was polystyrene or plastic, possibly coming through the joining waterways or dumped by visitors.

What can you do to help reduce this? Where you can, don't use polystyrene products. Some states have banned cups, etc made of this material. At the moment we can't use keep-cups but when you get that cafe takeaway coffee ask for a paper cup. Another big source is packing material - what you do get should be disposed of properly.

Drains in our area run into local drains then into waterways ending in lakes or in the bay. Please keep in mind what we can do to improve the water quality in our community.

Stuart, Ron and I went to Springvale for another successful RYDA day. I am happy to say Anat is back and making a big impact on the students. This month we were partnered with 3 members from Dandenong-Endeavour Hills. Thanks to Stuart for the Johnny Cash singalong.

During the four day observation period from 30 April to 3 May, 2021, Whitehorse residents are invited to find, photograph and document the native wildlife that lives and grows in our neighbourhoods.

Working together to find and document nature in our area helps scientists and land managers study and protect these species. By joining the City Nature Challenge, not only do you learn more about your local nature, but you can also make Whitehorse a better place – for you and other species!

## RCFH BLACKBURN STATION CRAFT MARKET – TRADER OF THE MONTH

### Powerhouse Cheese

Barbara Power started making her own cheeses over 10 years ago. With a degree in Microbiology she had a good scientific foundation to base her production. Two years ago, she started up her own commercial business **Powerhouse Cheese** and persuaded her sister, Donna Hall, who also has a Science degree, to leave her native New Zealand and join her in this venture. These two Artisan Cheesemakers use cow's milk in small 100 litre batches of milk from St David's Dairy in Fitzroy. They sell their cheeses at markets every Saturday and Sunday around the Melbourne area or you can order on line for pick up on Monday afternoon. The rest of the week you will find them busy in their cheesery making their standard Blackburn Blue, Whitehorse White and Ash Bree cheeses or producing new varieties like their Bellbird Blue or a surface ripened Rosella Red which may become another standard offering in the future. Certainly, these two talented very local artisan cheesemakers running **Powerhouse Cheese** have a future.
