



Achievements: Thirty two points of data were listed in this part of the application. These were accompanied by 12 pages of supporting information.

Club Group activities. A number were listed.

Group recycling: Thank you Ron for leading the way for the District and the club in the coin and stamp collecting.

Individual Activities:

List of the environmental and sustainability activities by one up to three members. This was quite extensive.
