The Chairman introduced our guest speaker, Sean Teer, who is the CEO of Envision Hands, a not for profit charity set up a number of years ago to help the disadvantaged. Eighteen months ago an idea of producing "mobility aids" using milk bottle tops (which a lot of members have been collecting for a couple of months). They use bottle tops with 2 and 4 recycling emblem. We need to "collect, clean and sort" before passing them on to Sean (Ron Brooks has volunteered to ensure this is done).

Sean showed examples of hand mobility aids, which are used in poorer overseas countries for children who are awaiting prosthetic devices.


Sean showed examples of other uses of the bottle tops too. He is asking Rotary for help in identifying countries where the products can be used.

lan is recovering from surgery so International is having a well-earned rest. Keep those glasses coming in as others can put them to good use.


#### **MUNA UPDATE**


