

HISTORICAL SOCIETY

As part of the local Historical Societies celebrations there was an excellent talk given at Vermont South library on the History of Vermont. I learned a lot about the local area. The Forest Hill Theatre opened in Mahoneys Rd in the 1960s and the Shopping Centre in 1964 with Channel ATV 0 in Hawthorn Rd in 1965. Films like *Camelot* and *A Funny Thing Happened on the way to the Forum* were shown 7 days a week with cartoons on Saturday mornings. Financially, it struggled and eventually it closed, then reopened as a Dendy Cinema showing mainly arthouse films. It finally closed in 1985 when the Hoyt's opened in Forest Hill Chase..
