David Bremner PHF, Pres RC of Forest Hill received a Community Service Award from the City of Whitehorse on Australia Day. During his 23 years in Rotary, he has held every position in the club. He has been President twice, Secretary three times, Treasurer twice, and has chaired the New Generations, Community Service, Vocational Service & Fund Raising committees plus newsletter editor twice, and is the club's Public Officer. His activity is shown by his average attendance of 92% of all club weekly meetings since he joined. He is Secretary of the very successful Whitehorse Farmers' Market run by the six Rotary clubs in the City of Whitehorse, served two years on the District Foundation committee and was the Secretary General of MUNA for two years

He was a player and club official for the Forest Hill Cricket Club for 28 years and was President of the club. He also umpired in the association for 5 years and was president of the umpires association.

David has been a strong member of Forest Hill (formerly the Mount Pleasant) Uniting Church. He has been in charge of the Planned Giving Programme for over 20 years, has served as Treasurer and for a number of years has been the chairman of the Church Property and Resources Committee. He also maintains the church website.

Prior to retirement he was the Executive Director of the Victorian Bar (1997-2004), and was the first Executive Director of the National Electricity Consumers Advocacy Panel in 2004

David Bremner's life has been devoted to working for the improvement of his fellows in his local community, his national community, and his international community most of whom he will never know or meet. He is an excellent example of a fair minded, community spirited person who has never sought any reward for his community work, in giving Service above Self.


