Steve Haylock, the Community Liaison Officer with the Eastern Health Foundation was guest speaker. He told us that to live longer we need to socialise. People from the "Blue Zones" in parts of Costa Rica, Japan, Sardinia and California have been found to live longest because they regularly get together in community groups. So keep attending Rotary! The Eastern Health Foundation was recently established to raise funds to improve the health and wellbeing of patients and their families in our community. Eastern is the 2nd largest provider of Health Care services in Victoria with 8 main hospitals and 50 campuses covering an area which is home to over 800,000 people. It has over 1 million patient attendances last year. The Foundation has a new patron, Peter Hitchener. They raised \$226,000 last year. Steve left us with a wish list of items they need at the hospitals and pointed out that like Rotary, 100% of money donated is spent on the items and they are very big on ensuring Recognition is given unless specifically requested otherwise.

John McPhee spoke about his "most memorable Rotary experience". It was over 25 years ago when he attended his first Rotary annual conference in Ballarat. Memorable because of the first night (with the Tinkers and the Smarts) they stayed at Craig's Hotel.... well the rooms were so bad they did not stay! They then stayed in different accommodation each night of the conference. An amusing and different slant on this regular feature in our speaking programme.

This week's **Rotary Foundation Thought** is about Changing and Saving Lives.

Have you ever considered that your contribution to The Rotary Foundation may mean the difference between life and death? Rotary Foundation Matching Grant projects have helped provide the Malawi Children's Village (MCV) with everything from clean water, food and medications to blankets, sewing machines and a windmill. The Rotary Club of Canandaigua, New York, USA and Chakunga Sibale, director of the MCV, founded the program in 1997 and it is supported locally by the Rotary Club of Limbe. "The MCV has had a very great effect to relieve the suffering of children in my country," says Sibale. Rotarian's contributions to this project have literally meant the difference between life and death for many of the children in the MCV program.
