

# An Update on Polio - The Final Hurdle

This article is based on a talk given by Past District Governor, Jenny Coburn, to the Rotary Club of Mont Albert and Surrey Hills.

There are four countries where polio is endemic, that is where polio has never ceased to exist, - Pakistan, Afghanistan, India and Nigeria. While there are outbreaks of polio in non-endemic countries which require mop exercises, it is the endemic countries which have provided the challenges to the world health organisations.



In 1988 there were more than 350,000 polio cases, in 2009 just 1,604! The figures presented below show that enormous inroads have been made towards eradication over recent years.

The increase in 2010 is non-endemic countries was due to an outbreak in Tajikistan with 458 cases.

The decrease of cases can be attributed to the new vaccine now being used as well as the National Immunisation Programs in place and the significant changes in attitudes at government level in the endemic countries.

The partners in driving the eradication of polio are World Health, Rotary, World Bank and the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation. Gates has provided US\$355mil, with a challenge to Rotary to raise US\$200mil. To date US\$160mil has been raised.

Jenny emphasised that it is vital that we continue to support the polio campaign and she spoke of the new advertising campaign "We Are This Close". The campaign uses famous figures from different countries and cultures to keep the focus on polio when we are "this close" to eradicating the disease from the world.

Like all big challenges big milestones have been set. The next Polio Eradication Targets are:

- End 2011 Cessation of all polio transmission in at least 2 of the 4 endemic countries
- End 2012 Cessation of all wild poliovirus transmission
- End 2013 Initial validation of 2012 milestones

It must be remembered that once gone, this disease will NOT reoccur.

Jenny concluded her talk with a quote from Margaret Chan, the Director General of the World Health Organisation - "As an international community, we have few opportunities to do something that is unquestionably good for every country and every child, in perpetuity. Polio eradication is one of these opportunities".

- Forest Hill Secondary College has not responded to the club's offer of funding for Model United Nations Assembly (MUNA) and National Youth Science Forum (NYSF).
- Prey T'Biang project in conjunction with Croydon club project is on hold for the time being as a result of delays in Cambodia.
- Country club relationship At its May meeting, the Board will consider providing funding for the District 9780 "Defying the Drift" program which seeks to make teenagers aware of the advantages of living and working in the 'bush'.
- Lily Harper Family bequest no progress as yet.
- Our Club Our Future a questionnaire asking for guidance on a range of issues was circulated to club members. A report on the outcome will be prepared.
- Major Project nothing further to report.
- ShelterBox District 9810 is not providing guidance on which of ShelterBox Australia (SBA) or Disaster Aid Australia (DAA) should be supported. Board to consider a ShelterBox speaker and a donation.
- Monash Community Raffle club has ordered two books.
- Treasurer accounts and report were passed.
- President-Elect, Fundraising Doug Berwick will coordinate club member attendance at Assembly (7<sup>th</sup> May). Blackburn and Whitehorse markets are progressing well. A trivia night is being organised, possible venues are NADRASCA and TARALYE.
- Immediate Past President Stuart Williams reported that the footy tipping project is underway.
- Fellowship the Board established a subcommittee of Doug Berwick, Chris Tuck, Bob Laslett and David Bremner to develop a program, action plan and budget for a membership drive. Chris Tuck is investigating a wine and cheese night at Blackburn Cellarbrations.
- Vice President Ray Smith reported that Roger Davis has pumpkins for us to collect and sell. It was decided that we have insufficient members available at the time to collect the pumpkins. They will instead be given to the local fire brigade as a fundraiser.
- Foundation, International Gary Baltissen is planning a guest speaker on Safe Water Save Lives (SWSL) for June. May will be promoted as "Wear a Hat" Day.
- Community, New Generations, Vocational Graham Sharman is investigating supporting disadvantaged youth to play soccer by paying their association affiliation fees. A vocational visit is being considered to either the School of Nursing (Box Hill TAFE), NADRASCA, Hand Brake Turn or Nunawading Toyota. Volunteers for the mock job interviews at Forest Hill College are being recruited. No applicants have been received for MUNA. No response from Forest Hill Secondary College for NYSF. The possibility of funding an indigenous community leader to attend a pastoral care training course is being investigated. The Ford Davis and Graham Taylor Apprenticeship Awards will be presented in April.
- Artwork for a generic RC of Forest Hill business card to be finalised and printed.
