# **MEETING REPORT FOR 1 AUGUST 2011**

Present Meeting Report 1 August

The meeting was chaired by Warwick Stott. Three visitors: Ken Wall (Assist Gov), Peter Skilbeck and the guest speaker Jenni Heenan from RC of Hampton. We had a lot away due to holidays, work and illness. Stan Harper is hoping to go home from the Peter James Centre soon. John Donaghey told of camping holidays and snakes.

The fines session raised \$32.40 for the foundation. The sarge was "thwarted" by Demon Bob having to attend a work Board meeting. Therefore, there was no "minute's silence" for the Grand Old Flag. Members who had brought handkerchiefs to pass on to Bob took them home clean. The sarge managed to scrounge fines using - "The Demons are like the little girl with the curl. When they are good, they are very, very good, but when they are bad, they are woeful." He did not gloat but thought 200 points would have been neater than 186 - messy.

Our guest speaker outlined how Disaster Aid International came about – and the split from ShelterBox. Some clubs in Australia, Canada the USA and UK and Ireland are backing DAI. Jenni had a good PowerPoint presentation and we saw - the box, tents and a Skyhydrant (which sounds fantastic). It can produce up to 80,000 litres of drinking water per day. The Pakistani floods displaced 23 million people – DAI went in to help. A box is given to a family and they sign for it. DAI are now in Sudan. All DAI materials are in Rotary colours – their boxes are truly boxes of hope, dignity and safety.

Acting Pres (and injured) Bob Laslett closed the meeting.

# STROKE A CHORD CHOIR'S PUBLIC DEBUT PERFORMANCE

Tickets are now available for the Choir's public debut performance. Stroke A Chord's debut performance is to be held in the theatre at the Karralyka Centre in Ringwood on Saturday 17 September as part of stroke week.

Tickets are \$12 Adult \$8 Concession \$5 Child

Stroke-a-Chord is a choir composed of stroke survivors with aphasia (loss of speech after stroke). The members can sing even though they can't speak. The choir sang at a performance for family and friends in September 2010. Over 160 people attended and the choir members reported increased self-confidence and improved self-esteem as a consequence of this successful performance.

This project prepares Stroke-a-Chord choir for two public performances in 2011. By performing in public, the choir members will experience further increased self-esteem and improved social communicative interaction which both contribute to improved quality of life. Performances provide positive emotional experiences, are invaluable opportunities for self-expression and they "showcase" the stroke survivors developing abilities in music and singing
