BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING HELD ON MONDAY 12 SEPT 2011 - KEY ISSUES DISCUSSED

- The Nominating Committee to nominate members to serve with President Elect Bob Laslett on the Board for 2012-2013 has been formed and will meet by 19th September. Members of the Committee are President Doug Berwick, VP Bob Williams, most recently available Past Presidents Stuart Williams and David Bremner and two nominated members, Glenys Grant and Stan Harper. Nominations for the Board positions will be announced prior to the AGM in November.
- Working With Children Card to be followed up with District to confirm current requirements.
- Solomon Islands Presentation to Rotary Clubs Box Hill Institute had planned to have students and teachers that participated in the Solomon Islands Project, including Indi Hangan, address individual clubs. This has proven difficult to arrange and they are now preparing a DVD for distribution to Clubs. We envisage showing the DVD at a suitable Club meeting.
- Club Anniversary and District Governor Visit 26th September 2011 invitations are being sent to honorary members and others to attend this event.
- Fellowship events Ron Brooks advised that several options had been presented to members and his Committee were working to advance the more popular options.

• Membership Recruitment – this is a complex project as it is influenced by a number of factors not the least of which is providing compelling reasons for a person to join Rotary. A Committee is being formed to address relevant issues.

MEETING REPORT

Speaker for the night was Brad Kyle.

Brad spoke of his walk across the top of Spain following a path known as 'The Way of St. James or the Camino de Santiago'. The walk is 800km long and it took Brad 35 days walking approx. 25 km per day.

Commencement of the walk is Saint Jean in France and ends in Santiago in Northern Spain. In 2010 some 270,000 people took the trip.

Along the way Brad stayed at various basic style hostel accommodation and at each resting point collected a stamp in his 'passport' which he showed to the appropriate people at the end of the trip and received a certificate of completion of the walk.

Interestingly, Brad undertook the walk mostly on his own and used it as a time of reflection which he described as life changing.

Brad who is married, lives at Mount Waverley and is an accountant and writer.

He has written a book of his travels entitled 'Memoirs of a Pilgrim' which has been published. Brad has just completed a children's book based on this experience.
