Following the club's decision last week, the number of Board members has been increased by one to ten. This will allow responsibility for the Community, Vocational and New Generations responsibilities to be allocated over two Directors.

## **FUNDING OF A MAJOR PROJECT**

While on the subject of worthy causes, the Board recently discussed funding a major project from accumulated Club funds. Suggestions so far include:

- Defying the Drift program. The program is similar to the Rotary Program of Enrichment (RYPEN) but is aimed at making young people aware of the opportunities for a career in the country - in essence, the program is trying to stop the drift of young people to the city.
- Australian Rotary Health Indigenous Health Scholarship. The object of this program is to provide a scholarship, which can be used to assist Indigenous students to undertake a course in a wide range of health related professions. It will enable students to use this education for the benefit of other Indigenous people in some of our remote areas.
- Supporting the MASH initiative of providing Drug and Alcohol Booklets into local secondary schools. In our case, it could be Forest Hill College.
- Purchasing a major piece/s of equipment for one of the local hospitals either Box Hill Hospital of Epworth Private Hospital

If members are aware of other projects that they believe are worthy of consideration they should advise our Secretary, Bill Marsh, or to President, Doug Berwick.
