LAST WEEK'S MEETING

In the absence of Pres. Doug, Bob Williams acted on his behalf whilst Ray Smith was chairman

There were 20 attendees, being 15 members, Barb Williams, Leon Moore the guest speaker and Jess Wynn (with two family members) to report on her (National Youth Science Forum (NYSF) experience.

Jess told us that she had a wonderful time in Perth where 144 students in her group spent 12 days during January at the University of Western Australia. The weather was extremely hot until the last day when it poured and everything was drenched.

She attended with an original intention of following in a biomedicine stream, and so her first session was on surgery where the students practised suturing (thank goodness not on live patients, but rather on dummies). They then visited a dental training facility (similarly practising drilling) and then a fertility centre discussing many things including the ethics of artificial insemination. They then attended the centre which is vying for the world-wide rights to build a massive telescope of a square kilometre array.

Jess has applied for the International Science Program, and she is now less sure as to what stream of science she will eventually follow.

She described her time as an absolutely fantastic experience

She is also very proud to have been selected to be a facilitator for next year's NYSF. Congratulations Jess. We are very proud of you.

We then heard from Leon Moore, a member of the Rotary Club of Doncaster, which club was challenged by Mary Wooldridge to set up a choir for people who have had a stroke and had had partial or complete aphasia to see if singing could stimulate their mind to learn to speak. This program had its origins in USA, and this was the first time that it was being attempted in Australia. The first choir had about 11 or so members (based on the number of people in the photo) and commenced in 2009. All of the members had not been able to speak much if at all, and the singing stimulates the ability to mouth words, little by little, which produces a feeling of belonging and then respect. He gave examples of people who had spoken virtually nothing for years, including 16 year old Lilly who had recovered from a coma after 4 years and now had partial aphasia (together with chronic fatigue syndrome just to complicate matters). She slowly improved her speech and her musical skills both on the guitar and in singing. She then performed in Cats, Jesus Christ Superstar and other stage musicals.

In conclusion, Leon's message was that you can recruit the best in people, and it would appear that he has achieved very high results in helping aphasic stroke victims to learn to improve their power of speech.

It was a very instructive evening with two very interesting speakers.
