### LAST WEEK'S MEETING

We had thirteen members and our guest speaker in attendance at our last meeting.

President Doug reported that the Board has decided to support the most popular two of the three projects voted on during the recent referendum on a new major project for the club. Doug noted that all three projects were of high quality and would greatly benefit the community. The club will therefore be supplying three electric beds to Box Hill Hospital and supporting two Indigenous Health Scholarships through Australian Rotary Health. The estimated cost of the projects over the next two years will be about \$20,000.

Bob Laslett was the club speaker and told of the time when he was seconded to the CSIRO to work on polymers. The work Bob participated in eventually led to major science awards for the principal researchers and the paper they issued bears his name as co-author. The secondment was highly successful for Bob in his professional development and has led to a long-term interest in polymers.

Wikipedia tells me that a polymer is a large molecule (macromolecule) composed of repeating structural units. These sub-units are typically connected by covalent chemical bonds. Although the term polymer is sometimes taken to refer to plastics, it actually encompasses a large class of compounds comprising both natural and synthetic materials with a wide variety of properties - I suspect I was out to lunch the day polymers were discussed at school!



Our guest was David Vincent who earlier this year was named by the Federal Government as one of forty 'People of Australia' ambassadors around the nation.

David was born in Sudan but his family was forced to flee the country when he was three following the breakout of civil war in 1983. He lived in refugee camps for about 18 years before moving to Australia in 2004. He now works with the Brotherhood of St Lawrence as Community Liaison Officer.

As a young child, he and his father were forced to leave their village and live in a

succession of refugee camps until they were separated. Along this journey, David saw many of his fellow refugees die from hunger, disease and war. Fortunately, David was eventually selected for settlement in Australia where he has completed a Bachelor of Arts degree in Political Science and Criminology.

David has focused his life on peace and reconciliation. He is a member of and a spokesperson for the United Nations Refugee Agency (UNHCR) in Australia and is now working with the Sudanese Government as it deals with the division of the country into two separate nations.

David's talk was inspiring as a lesson in how a person can overcome disadvantage, fear and an inclination towards revenge to instead bring peace and goodwill to the world.

It was a privilege to have David as our guest.
