

LAST WEEK'S MEETING

Rotary Club of Forest Hill Meeting Report for Monday August 6th 2012

Once again we were treated to an excellent night of food, fellowship, fun and a fascinating Guest Speaker.

Stan Harper began with a reflection about peace and later gave us a most interesting account of some prisoners of war that he met during his days in the Army toward the end of the Second World War. Stan also, in his role as Sergeant, with his usual wit and insight, managed to extract \$40.10 in fines.

Our Guest Speaker was Lisa Renn. Lisa is an Accredited Practicing Dietitian with a Bachelor of Applied Science in Physical Education and a Masters degree in Nutrition and Dietetics. She is also the Media spokesperson for the Dietitians Association of Australia. She has contributed her clear message about nutrition to newspapers, magazines, radio and television, and has appeared on Channel Nine's show "What's good for you"

Her talk was entitled "Healthy Eating in Retirement" and covered Heart Health, Bone Health, and Digestive Health. Her remarks about diet gave us all some food for thought and gave our minds a workout as she outlined the importance of exercise. Obviously her remarks were close to the bone and got to the heart of the matter as Chairman Doug tried in vein to cut off the flow of (b)leading questions at the end of Lisa's address. It provided many of us with an excellent reality check as we were confronted with what it takes to have an expectation of a healthy long life in retirement. Several Rotarians purchased the book which she wrote, entitled "Body Warfare, the secret to permanent weight loss". A fitting conclusion to a most informative and enjoyable night. Watch this space. PEACE



Stan related the story of his friends the Sorianos family that he met while serving in the Philippines in 1945. The family quit Spain in 1939 seeking a peaceful future in Manila. They replicated their food importing business and prospered. In 1942 the Japanese invaded and promised special privileges. These turned out to be working in an internment camp and no contact with their 8 years old son who had been sent to a nearby island.

After a 37-month internment the religious couple opened their home to any soldier, sailor or airman for prayers in a specially-designated room for that purpose. All round the room were signs and messages of thanks from the internees. However, the large central hand-embroidered hanging simply said "Thank you. May peace be with you always".

When the Aussie units packed up to go home the Sorianos displayed a large painted sign "Thank you for restoring peace to the Philippines". Stan's prized possession is a rather tattered copy of the final day issue of the bulletin from the internment camp which the Sorianos gave him and is a true account of life in that camp. Stan also displayed a copy of the August 15, 1945 Melbourne Herald with its Peace headline.

Lavena pre-school update

As you know, last year RC Forest Hill made a very generous donation to help ABCD and RC Templestowe build a new pre-school next to the Lavena Primary School on Taveuni Island. The project turned out to be an outstanding success. One of the main reasons for the success was the involvement of the Deakin University Global Citizenship Program - and in particular the 9 amazing students who came with us to help build the school .





On Wednesday 8 August at the RC Templestowe meeting the students presented their experiences working in a remote location with ABCD, with Rotary and how they - and the children of Lavena - have all benefited from the experiences.

It was an inspiring evening and the five Forest Hill representatives thoroughly enjoyed themselves. Templestowe thought it was a take-over bid.

Ken Wall gave us a copy of the video shown on the night and we will use this at a meeting soon.

Many thanks to you and your colleagues for attending the Deakin UNI students presentation at RC Templestowe last week.

I wanted to share some good news with you - last week I received an email from the Grants Coordinator at TRF letting me know that our application for a matching grant to complete the fit-out of the new pre-school at Lavena had been approved! It was a condition of the matching grant that we could demonstrate that we had completed the building first.

Getting the grant means that the wonderful building that you helped to construct can now be fully equipped with desks and chairs, whiteboards and cupboards - and more importantly that we can fill the cupboards with a good range of learning materials, drawing materials and equipment to give the pre-schoolers a great start to their education before they move on to the primary school.

I also wanted to remind you and thank you - the success of this ABCD project conducted by RC Templestowe has been dependant to a very large extent on the contributions from RC Forest Hill and your individual members. For example - your club donation itself paid for the entire roof!

In round figures we ended up with 44 children supported at the primary school for one year at \$250 per head and a little over \$12,000 donated towards the building of the pre-school. Deakin Uni students added another \$5k we have a DDF contribution of \$3k and the TRF matching grant for \$6k.

Angela and I are going back to Taveuni and to Savusavu at the end of September and of course one of our visits will be to Lavena. I'll make sure we capture some good images of the school so that your members can see what they have achieved.

We will also be visiting a number of other schools that have asked to be involved in future ABCD projects. I'm hoping to come back with around 10-12 schools identified and 'qualified' as being suitable candidates to the extent that we can be sure they will benefit from a project and can manage their role in the project effectively. The size and scope is likely to range from say, support for maybe 10 children at one of the smaller schools - right up to a Lavena scale project complete with maybe 40 children supported and a building project involved as well. Rotary Club support and future partnerships with organisations like Deakin Uni are going to be critical to our success.

I think I might have already shared my dream of maybe having 100 schools with 100 Rotary clubs involved supporting 10,000 children...! That might take a few months... I guess it's a big dream but thanks a million for your part in making it happen!
