

LAST WEEK'S MEETING

Report for meeting held on Monday 8/10/2012

Meeting was opened by Sergeant Stan and ably chaired by John McPhee. We had 12 members in attendance as well as our guest speaker, Sneha Arya and her father. Sneha is our Club's National Youth Science Forum (NYSF) student nominee who will be attending the next forum in January 2013 in New Zealand. Stan was in good form collecting \$34.45 for the Rotary Foundation.

Chris Tuck presented his talk on an aspect of peace. Chris told us about Kraft Foods in Germany just prior to the second World War and how head office had bid their colleagues farewell and told them "see you after the war", which they did. He mentioned that under German law foodstuff like cheese had to be held in Berlin rather than other parts of the country. This apparently stemmed from the period after WW2 when the City of Berlin was blockaded and it was considered prudent to have food processing done in that city in case of a total blockade by the then USSR. Chris described what Berlin was like when it was surrounded by the Berlin Wall and the difficulty in getting in and out of the city. He also spoke of the problems that West Germany encountered in its unification with East Germany. Difficulties that now cause unrest in the general population as Germany tries to bail out Greece, Spain and Portugal. I think that Chris's message was that peace brought unification to Germany, however, I will stand corrected if I missed the correct message.

Our guest speaker was Sneha Arya. Sneha told us that she is currently studying Year 11 at Wesley College where she is also an international baccalaureate student. She has also recently returned from France where she completed further studies. Sneha is looking forward to the hands-on experience provided by the NYSF and also meeting scientists currently working in various fields of study. We hope to hear from Sneha again when she returns from the NYSF and visits our Club. We wish her all the best and trust that she will enjoy all aspects of the NYSF program.

Doug Berwick thanked Sneha on behalf of the Club and President Bob closed the meeting and invited members to join their Committee groups before going to their place for a home hosting session.

PEACE

Peace Presentation Sep 8 2012

The opposite of peace is war and that includes the cold war.

My family visited Berlin in the 1980's whilst the Berlin wall surrounded West Berlin.

It was quite concerning to be in a place where you turned the corner in the city and immediately reached a concrete wall with barbed wire and Check Point Charlie.

Berlin is a beautiful city with many parks and gardens.

To enter Berlin you drove directly along a fortified road from West Germany and you did not stop. The multinational food company I worked for stored cheese for maturing in West Berlin in case there was another blockade.

In 1989 the Berlin wall came down so there was easier access to the Eastern Block countries. This gave many West European companies the opportunity to invest in manufacturing plants in countries like East Germany, Poland and Hungary.

Our company bought several food processing facilities in Eastern Europe at this time when we were able to establish the true owners of the plants.

In addition governments like the West German Government invested heavily in East Germany to improve the infrastructure.

I would like to think that the lowering of the iron curtain has promoted peace and the Western Companies and Governments who have invested in Eastern Europe will improve the lives of the citizens of Eastern Europe.
