LAST WEEK'S MEETING

Vocational visit to Doncaster BMW

On Monday evening we had the privilege to visit the largest BMW showroom in the southern hemisphere and the third largest BMW dealership in the world. Our host and guide was Ingo Reisch, Managing Director and the energy and spirit behind this stunning dealership. We started in the massive showroom with its central coffee shop and reception and observed the beautiful flooring. The different tiles, timber and glass signify certain aspects of BMW marketing. The black tiles, with the most cars displayed represent an autobahn, special new cars are parked on a glass floor. Michael Williams demonstrated what the BMW key tells the service advisor; everything from brake pad wear, tyre pressure, Km travelled and amount of oil in the engine. We visited the large workshop with its well- equipped bays. The amount of computerization was amazing. Large exhaust hoses are connected to all exhausts whilst cars are running. Modern auto servicing practice is not so much repairing as replacing components. We moved to the large used car area, saw the impressive underground wine cellar and then the funky Mini Shop where bright colours capture the Mini mood. We exited that building through the Motorad showroom (BMW bikes) and saw the extensive range. All police bikes are now BMW and Doncaster has the contract to service them. Back in the main building we ventured up to the "Flight Deck"-a function room on the third level that has a panoramic view across Melbourne, all the way to Melbourne Airport. This room has its own stories and some unique memorabilia. Ingo told us the story behind the historic bike in his office. The buildings are impressive examples of environmentally smart designs. Examples range from the decorative solar panels across the front that cut down the electricity costs, extra thick insulated glazing to windows that impacts on heating and cooling as well as extensive water capture that is reused on site. The 169 staff are valued. Their lunch room doubles as a 150 person function space with its 5-star hotel quality kitchen and the room opens out onto a deck with an outdoor pizza oven. We ate in sight of a very special Mini. The Mini Goodwood is one of only 1,000 produced. It is the most expensive Mini and was fitted out under the guidance of the Rolls Royce factory. A big thank- you to the marketing staff for organizing the catering. After two hours at the dealership it was easy to see why Doncaster BMW won the 2011 BMW trophy for excellence in professionalism, presentation and performance. President Bob thanked Ingo for his time and allowing us to briefly share his passion for BMW excellence and customer service.


