Reports included Farmers' Market being successful on Sunday, and Mike has bags, labels, help on Thursday for the Bake Sale on the weekend; also Hope Katolo has so far raised \$2500 via the raffle; also the Youth Achievement Award report will be on the D9810 website. Mince pies are still available at \$16 per dozen.

PP Bob Williams then commenced his audio-visual of his and Barb's train trip and extras involving the Indian Pacific and some coach trips in Western Australia. From Perth they went north to Monkey Mia and the Pink Lake and Geraldton. After returning to Perth they visited Rottnest Island and then

south to Busselton and the caves. Wildlife, flora, underground caves, beautiful scenery and apparently good company was there aplenty. They then returned to Perth from where they joined the train to Sydney, a trip of over 4000 kms, 4 days and three nights, passing through Kalgoorlie, Rawlinna, Cook across the Nullabor eventually arriving at Adelaide, had a breather, and then on board again to Broken Hill, now renowned for its involvement with Priscilla, the Blue Mountains and into Sydney. Put the date in your diary and try to put together a group to bring along. A great show, great company and superb catering all for a great cause.


