MEETING REPORT

President Stuart opened the meeting in the traditional way of two toasts, the 1st to Australia and the 2nd to Rotary International.

President Stuart referred to the bushfires which had affected so many people in our State of Victoria and welcomed 13 members, two partners and the guest speaker Rochelle Cannington, from "St Kilda Mums".

Stuart thanked members for attending the barbecue last week and thanked Bill Marsh for his hospitality and, Chris Tuck for the visit to his cherry orchard.

The chairperson Sue Ballard welcomed 13 members, two partners and our guest speaker Rochelle Cannington.

Reports:

1. Youth. Glenys reported of the District's Youth Service Showcase on Friday, 14 February and our Representatives from MUNA would be speaking.
2. Sec Bob had no report.
3. Warwick reported that the list of names for the Farmers Market, was in circulation, along with the Blackburn market roster.
4. Ron Brooks informed the members, that there is no meeting next week and the following week would be the "Great Australian Quiz" that Sue is organising.
5. Mike reported on the Peridot Theatre Night and was aiming for 100+ people to attend.
6. Ron Brooks reported the end to plastic bottle tops collection, but still required stamps, coins to be collected.
7. President-elect Sue informed members that some discussion has taken place regards to our Club joining with another Club for the Annual Change overnight.
8. Sue, put forward a suggestion that we could be assisting bushfire victims, by encouraging schools and other community members to grow trees, plants and vegetables.

Chairperson Sue introduced our guest speaker Rochelle Cannington from St Kilda Mums.

Rochelle gave a PowerPoint presentation on how the organisation was started in 2009 at a volunteer's home and where pickups were done, using a bicycle.

10 years later they now operating out of their own warehouse in Clayton and have branches in Benalla and Geelong

St Kilda Mums collect baby goods such as car seats, change tables, bathtubs, clothes, nappies, cot sheets or any item that is suitable for babies or young children in good clean conditions.

At the end of their first year's operation they gave away 439 items and in June 2019, 59,463 items were donated helping 20,403 babies.

If a mother was to purchase the essential items for the baby it would be a cost of approximately \$950 where St Kilda Mums give away the goods at a cost to the organisation of \$126 per child.

The organisation today has 3141 volunteers across Victoria picking up goods which are in a safe and sound condition and where necessary clean prams car seats etc. before they are given away.

Over a 10-year period, St Kilda Mums had grown to a much larger organisation serving 79 local government areas.

The organisation receives no government funding, but they are helped by donations and fundraising, and the last financial year raised \$2.5 million.

John Donaghey gave the vote of thanks and presented Rochelle with a handmade wooden pen.

To end the meeting Pres Stuart asked each member to give a short story on their joys of summer. Some interesting tales were told, which brought back interesting memories and happiness for members.

The meeting closed at 8:10 PM.
