

Each awardee spoke and was questioned about their dreams and schooling. Jessica spoke about the superb culture at Box Hill High. She complimented the students on the respect they show staff and their respect for learning. She gave a brief overview of the recent school developments. Stuart thanked Jessica.

Sergeant Stuart opened the meeting with a moment of reflection. He said that Rotary is in the business of helping build dreams. Tonight we get to hear from recipients of the Ford Davis Endeavour Awards. What image do we have of today's students?
