

In the last week, I have collected 9.4kg of coins and a very large wad of notes from RC of Boronia who have a collection jar in a Bendigo Bank. Last night I collected 3.7 kgs from Heather Bremner who told me that some of them came from Graham Plaw. So a big thankyou to both of them.

I now have 37.7kgs of foreign coins which together with the 60kgs I have already couriered off to UNICEF is 97.7 kgs which they estimate could be worth about \$3,500!!! Plus, I now have an 8cm thick wad of notes when compressed down.


