#### LAST WEEK'S MEETING



Sonia Downie is full of enthusiasm in raising money for Nepal. She has been there seven times and is planning an eighth visit in September. Sonia first went there in 2004. She explained that not only mountain climbers went to Nepal (it has 8 of the highest 10 mountains in the world) but it has always been regularly visited by trekkers, by botanists, and is famous for it's medicinal plants. Agriculture and Tourism are the two big money earners for this country of 28 million people of the size

of Victoria who are Hindus and Buddists. Sonia went there with her two children (then grade 5 and 6) in 2005 to live for a year.

Sonia comes from a Rotary background. She is an ex Rotaracter, her father was in the RC of Lilydale and she met her husband, who died from a brain tumour when he was only 41, at a Rotaract meeting. She works in the Community Care system. So there she was in Katmandu at the local farmers market when the first earthquake hit. She had only a few days before returned from a trek through Langtang a village with 55 lodges and guest houses due to its position on the trekking route. Langtang has vanished. There are now no buildings left standing. She explained to us that Nepal has no government social structure, no medical system, it relies an Aid organisations.



She started helping the local people immediately and worked with FORE, Friends of Royal Enfield, who are working locally with the Village Development Committee. FORE ran motor bike tours around Nepal. The FORE project she is raising money for is called 7.6 Life to Dubachour and Beyond. Put this into Google and you will get their Facebook page. There are loads of pictures of FORE doing projects to help – local people helping local people.

She has brought some bracelets and necklaces, and some cashmere ponchos (\$79) made by locals and is selling them here to raise money to take back to Nepal. She will be selling them at the Blackburn market and has been selling them at St Andrews Market.

#### **OUT AND ABOUT IN MELBOURNE**

#### **VISIT TO THE ALEXANDRA CLUB**

A number of clubs for women appeared in Melbourne in the wake of the establishment of the Princess Ida Club among female students at the University of Melbourne in 1888, indicative of women's increasing access to the public sphere. The Austral Salon, founded by women writers in 1890 to encourage women to take an interest in the arts, survives, but most of the smaller clubs later consolidated into two, the Alexandra Club and the Lyceum Club. The Alexandra Club, founded as the Wattle Blossom Club in 1903, provided a space in the city for establishment women. Beginning in rooms at 157 Collins Street, the club moved frequently before purchasing its own premises at 139 Collins Street, in 1917. Strictly nonpolitical, the club was designed to function as a second home for its 800 members, offering rooms where they could dine, stay, rest and entertain. Although it suffered a decline in membership during the 1930s Depression, the club expanded in the postwar years, increasing its membership to 1400 following its amalgamation in 1965 with the Quamby Club, which catered for country women visiting the city. In 1981 the club sold its premises, moving to its current rooms at 81 Collins Street in 1983.

The Friends of the Johnston Collection had a Soiree there last week when two musicians, a final year student and a fellow, from ANAM played a range of works for violin and cello followed by a tour of the four storey Club with its many paintings and photos. A breath taking one of Queen Alexandra (of Denmark) -Edward VII's wife. Oh! 
