Rotary is a powerful force for good in the world on a macro and a local level. Rotary was included in the group that structured up the United Nations after WW Two. Rotary has partnered with many organisations to provide maximum impact. Our End Polio Now campaign is a partnership with WHO, US Centre for Disease Control and the Gates Foundation. Interplast was an idea of a Rotarian and in 1983, was set up between Rotary and the Australian College of Surgeons.

Rotary provides 25% of the funding and Interplast works in 17 countries. It is a huge operation usually sending out between 70 and 80 teams per year to Asia and the Pacific-from Mongolia to Kiribati. Patients have ranged in age from 89 years to 28 days old. We have supported Interplast for many years by having club members on the District committee and since 2008 we have donated \$9,167. There is no doubt the 26,000 surgeries have dramatically changed the lives for the better of those patients. Thanks Janette.

COVID IN MONTREAL

I have a friend in Montreal, Canada. Bob and I were there 2 years ago. I found Canada a delightful country that I believed I could comfortably live in - apart from the very harsh winters. Canada has hardly been mentioned in the COVID-19 statistics. Melbourne (5 million population) is marginally bigger than Montreal (4.3 million population). The situation in Montreal remains "worrisome". The other city in Quebec Province- Quebec City is in a similar situation to Melbourne and Victoria. Many restrictions have been or are about to be lifted. Non-essential travel between regions is still discouraged. Montreal is still in fairly heavy lock-down. The latest date proposed for "deconfinement" has been moved to May25. All schools are still closed and will be until the end of the school year. As of May 12 -- Montreal has had 20,232 confirmed cases. (Victoria 1554--18 deaths). Montreal had almost 91 deaths last week. I have not seen a similar breakdown of figures here but the Canadian figures show the virus can infect young people. The figures from Montreal: confirmed cases

0 -4 years -- 190


5 - 9 yrs -- 173
