43 people were in attendance for the Youth Citizenship Awards and the meeting room was abuzz with proud parents and excited children. Bill Marsh stepped up to the plate, in place of John McPhee who was indisposed, and presented the opening address giving an overview of the rationale behind these awards and that these young people have been nominated by their school as being outstanding contributors to their school community.

As part of the evening Bill called on our guest speaker, Raagini Meyha to take the stage, which she did with considerable aplomb. Raagini spoke about her time with RYPEN, an acronym for Rotary Youth Program of

Enrichment. RYPEN is a residential weekend workshop for teenagers 14 -17 years and encourages participants to step out of their comfort zone, develop goal-setting skills, working with others in team building exercises, self-awareness, fulfilling expectations and getting involved. In her closing comments, Raagini went on to say that it pays to listen, because "everyone has a story" and "one compliment can go along way".

Raagini was thanked by Martine and presented with a wood-turned pen crafted by our residential photographer, Mr Ray Smith.

The presentations then continued with Ron Brooks talking about the Citizenship award for Years 8-9 students and that the prize consists of a framed Certificate and a \$75 voucher.

Incoming DG, Malcolm Chiverton was then asked to hand out certificates. As each student was called forward their school representative read out their citation and they were then presented with their award.

After the event we held a quick board meeting to discuss Berengarra School and it has been agreed to allocate \$3000 from the Harper funds to the school under the proviso that the project is completed, at which time, the funds will be released.
