Following the main course, the meeting proceeded to the award presentations, and chairman Ron spoke briefly about the man behind the award and Graham's commitment to development of young peoples' life skills and work commitment. Mark Whitehead operations Manager Electrical then introduced his awardee Tom McMeikin-Evans outlining Tom's commitment and role modelling to his trade learning. President Bill then presented the award (tools of trade) to Tom.



Roger then came forward to present the Davis encouragement awards and outlined his father's commitment to encouragement for youth to achieve to the best of their ability in all that they do. Ross Bardon then introduced the awardee James Park and in doing so outlined the difficulties that James has had to confront and overcome in fulfilling the level of competency and commitment to his chosen trade. James was presented with a selection of his tools in trade. Finally, Michael Cope spoke on the selection process for the Automotive award and introduced the awardee Bawi Cinzah. Bawi is a refugee from Burma who has exhibited commitment to his employment and learning as he seeks to establish his life in Australia. Bawi in his acknowledgement of the award stated how much this means to him and his family obligations, and to his Burmese community as a whole. In fact, all three recipients were most impressive in acknowledging their awards.



Raffles were drawn prior to closing of the meeting and raised \$90.00. Bill closed the meeting and good fellowship followed.

Sergeant's Reflection 28 May

This Rotary Club has valued and rewarded excellence in vocational training and education for the last 30 years. There are varied types of intelligence and they are of equal value. When I heard a senior Federal minister equate TAFE education with basket weaving, I wept.

This Rotary club has continued to support TAFE students while successive governments have run-down and starved TAFE of funding. Covering skill shortages in our economy with 457 visas was a low cost and short-sighted approach of little long-term benefit to our country. The lack of will and desire to build and sustain a viable vocational education sector lead to appalling outcomes and millions of dollars being syphoned off into private bank accounts.

Just recently, there have appeared signs that our politicians might be starting to value vocational education by giving adequate financial support and a level of prestige. I won't attempt to guess at their motives.

We need to develop excellence across all occupations for the social and economic health of our society. Rotarians, it is said, are like a candle. They give of themselves and light up others. Tonight we are delighted to shine our light on a couple of young achievers and hope that together we can light up the world.
