It was great to have with us Ayo, Tim and Tina the Box Hill High students, worthy recipients of the Ford Davis Endeavour Scholarships, their coordinator John Middenway and some interested partners. The students brought vitality as they told of their dreams in science, revolutions (well, the history thereof) and the performing arts. Guest speaker Grant Stewart, chaplain to the Melbourne Storm, enlightened us on the differences between rugby's two codes and why sporting bodies request chaplains. There were plenty of questions and with some timely anecdotes he explained his listening role as he travelled alongside the Storm players. Having worked with them for 15 years he shed some interesting lights on the team particularly with the number of current sporting controversies.

PEACE

This past year was one of major accomplishments for Rotary and your Rotary Foundation.

Extraordinary progress was made toward the eradication of polio. We made history when India was removed from the list of polio-endemic countries — leaving just Afghanistan, Nigeria, and Pakistan. A difficult road lies ahead, but thanks to the commitment and generosity of Rotarians and friends, we are confident that Rotary will lead the way toward a polio-free world.

We also expanded Rotary's reach in new and effective ways by entering into partnerships with Mercy Ships and UNESCO-IHE. And we built on our record of humanitarian service by continuing our strong relationships with the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, USAID, Aga Khan University, Oikocredit and the Rotary Peace Centers.

Over half a million young people worldwide participated in our New Generations programs. Their involvement in Rotary Youth Exchange, Rotaract and Interact clubs, and RYLA events helped them develop skills that they'll need to become service-minded community and global leaders - and future Rotarians.

In 2012, The Rotary Foundation also earned top marks from several independent charity evaluators, including the American Institute of Philanthropy, Charity Navigator and the Wise Giving Alliance.

As we look ahead, we can be proud of all that Rotarians have accomplished. I am pleased to share the digital version of the *2011-12 Rotary International and Rotary Foundation Annual Report* ([click here](#)), which offers a firsthand look at how Rotarians are working to improve the lives of people in need. John Liddell - A Plan for Repowering Australia

John Liddell is a volunteer speaker representing Beyond Zero Emissions (BZE), an independent, not-for-profit research group concerned about the impact of global warming and with the goal of getting Australia off all forms of fossil fuel. He will explain key elements of their roadmap for taking Australia to 100% renewable energy for our grid. BZE's fully-costed plan, specifies ONLY proven, commercially-available baseload renewable technologies that are increasingly powering other economies across the world. Australia is, he believes, lagging behind in embracing 21st century technology. John has been, amongst other things, a business trainer, a marketing manager and has run his own training franchise. He has also taught business skills at both TAFE and university level. He has a BSc (Hons) in Geography and a post graduate Management Diploma. While he has followed a career in business, he has always retained a deep interest in the functioning of our planet's environment. Until June 2011, he had been a member of the Rotary Club of Richmond for about 15 years and has a Paul Harris Fellow Award. Married, with 2 adult children, he is now retired and lives with his wife Glenys in Mont Albert North.
